



Biography James Hillman

The pioneering imaginative psychology of James Hillman that will soon span five decades has entered cultural history, affecting lives and minds in a wide range of fields. He is the author of twenty-eight books with translations into over twenty languages. For the creativity of his thinking, the originator of the post-Jungian Archetypal Psychology and author of a *Terrible Love of War*, *The Soul's Code*, *Kinds of Power*, and *The Force of Character* has received many honors, including the medal of the Presidency of the Italian Republic.

James Hillman became the first Director of Studies of the Jung Institute in Zurich in 1959. He was a student of Carl Jung. In the 1970's, he co-founded the Dallas Institute for the Humanities and Culture with a focus on city and soul. He has been a practicing Jungian analyst. He has held distinguished lectureships at the Universities of Yale, Princeton, Chicago and Syracuse.

He assumed the editorial leadership of Spring Publications in 1970. Initially, a publishing house for early post Jungian work, Spring Publications evolved into a niche-publishing house devoted to soul in culture. It publishes, and blurs the lines -- of the nature of religion, art, therapy (especially the therapy of therapy and the therapy of ideas) philosophy, ritual, initiation, the history of ideas, and the cult of soul. The web site is -- www.springpublications.com. Hillman served as editor of Spring Journal from 1970 to 1999.

His 1975, *Re-visioning Psychology* was nominated for a Pulitzer. *Utne Reader* selected Hillman as one of the top 100 people who could change your life. *The Soul's Code* stayed at the top of the New York Times nonfiction best-seller list for nearly a year.

James Hillman is currently at work preparing *The James Hillman Uniform Edition*, a ten-volume collection of scholarly papers, lectures, public talks and interviews. After decades in Europe, and a short stay in Dallas, he resides in rural Connecticut.
